Systemic racism and the marginalization of BIPOC have immediate and long-term harmful effects. Archaeology has contributed to building and maintaining the status quo of white supremacy and colonialism. Archaeologists have helped to create and perpetuate the notion of race as a biological reality. The Archaeology Graduate Student Caucus maintains that race is not founded in biology but is a product of colonialist oppression. We know that racism has direct biological and social consequences, which harm Black and Indigenous communities.

Silence is compliance. We, as archaeologists and academics, need to do better.

The Archeology Graduate Student Caucus commits to the following actionable items:

- 1. Acknowledge the role academia has and continues to play in upholding systems of racial oppression by lobbying our department for increased and improved teaching about white supremacy, racial injustice, and colonialism in archaeology undergraduate and graduate courses.
- 2. Acknowledge the lack of diversity within the AGSC. We will work with our department to make the graduate program a more welcoming space to promote enrolment of BIPOC. We will apply for funds to host a series of seminars on how to better educate ourselves as allies in academia.
- 3. Commit to supporting all organizations on campus that support students and communities who are marginalized in our society. We will communicate and disseminate the available resources from these organizations.
- 4. To support BIPOC students within our department, the Archaeology Graduate Student Caucus will create a resource guide. This guide will have information on university groups, as well as larger community-based organizations.
- 5. Amend the Archaeology Graduate Student Caucus constitution to establish a permanent Equity Officer executive position in the Archaeology Graduate Student Caucus to act as an advocate for equity, diversity, and inclusion, within the department and liaison with other groups dedicated to social justice. Encourage the Graduate Student Society to establish a similar director to act as a watchdog for oppressive behaviour within the SFU community as a whole.

Black Lives Matter. We stand with Black communities, as well as all those impacted by racism and violence. We call for systemic reforms in criminal justice, education, and other spheres essential to establishing a world where equal rights and opportunities exist for all.
