case has been reported in British Columbia, SFU is actively reviewing its infectious disease protocols, pandemic plan and meeting with key stakeholders to ensure the University's three campuses are prepared and able to respond. Consistent with travel advisories issued by the Government of Canada, on January 29, SFU recommended that students, faculty and staff not travel to China for university-related programs and activities at this time.
