Your mythical town, Manawaka, Manitoba, as it appears in <a href="The Stone Angel">The Stone Angel</a>, <a href="A Jest of God">A Jest of God</a>, and <a href="The Diviners">The Diviners</a>, is as well known to your readers as their own back yards. For you have dealt with the place and the people with an emotion as genuine as your craft is honest.

As you yourself have written:

The whole process of fiction is a mysterious one, and a writer, however experienced, remains in some ways a perpetual amateur, or perhaps a perpetual traveller, an explorer of those inner territories, those strange lands of the heart and spirit.

As fellow-travellers with you, we have shared these explorations into the very heart of the fear and the strangeness, the wonder and the longing of life.
