## **Convocation Address By Dr. Julio Montaner**

Argentine-Canadian physician, director of the British Columbia Centre for Excellence in HIV/AIDS, president of the International AIDS Society and one of the world's leading AIDS specialists.

An honorary Doctor of Science was conferred on Dr. Julio Montaner during the Faculty of Applied Sciences, Faculty of Environment and Faculty of Health Sciences ceremony on Friday, June 18, 2010. The following is Dr. Montaner's convocation address.

Mr. Chancellor, Mr. President, members of the Board of Governors and Senate, faculty, honoured guests, graduates, family and friends, it is indeed my honour and privilege to come in front of you today to accept this very special honorary degree. To me, this represents the combination of a very long trip that I started in 1981 when I had the honour and privilege of joining Dr. James Hogg laboratory at UBC for what was supposed to be a one year stint that ended up being the rest of my life. Mr. Chancellor, let me reassure you that if today was the last day of my life, I wouldn't change anything.

Since then, my life has been diverted to work on HIV and AIDS, one of the most serious pandemics in front of us and I'm happy to tell you that we have made tremendous progress and I am particularly honoured by the collaboration that we have developed with SFU that has allowed us to create a very vibrant group of people who are truly committed to defeat this epidemic. I thank President Michael Stevenson, Dean John O'Neil and also my own president, President Toope for helping us and foster this collaboration which should be an example of how these two great universities can work together now and in the future. Together while striving to conquer the common enemy, which is HIV and AIDS and indeed together, we have developed a plan that will do so and we are committed to doing so and stop HIV and AIDS.
