Outline:

Surrey Pretrial Services Centre is 1 of 10 correctional centres throughout the province of BC. We house individuals who are awaiting trial, serving a provincial jail sentence or being held pending an immigration review. Surrey Pretrial Services Centre is a secure centre that offers inmate programs, education and vocational training that address factors that contribute to criminal behaviour.

Description of tasks / role:

Students will be actively involved in creating and delivering unique programs and activities that will be enjoyable, meaningful and purposeful to those who are incarcerated. The goal is to provide positive social engagement and change with incarcerated individuals. Students will work alongside with correctional officers to engage and motivate incarcerated individuals to participate in programs and activities offered. Furthermore, depending on the student's experience and studies, he / she may design, implement and measure the effectiveness of a program or activity on their own.

Requirements of the students:

Surrey Pretrial Services Centre is a 24/7 operation. Students may come in on any available days between Monday and Sunday. Hours are flexible, but between 06:30 - 16:30. Surrey Pretrial Services Centre is conveniently located in the Justice Precinct on 57th Ave and cross street of 144 Street. It may be accessed via public transit and parking is available on site. Students will be required to complete a security clearance form, but will not be required to pay for it. Once security clearance has been granted, students will complete a 1 hour security orientation prior to placement. Students will be escorted by correctional officers while within the secure envelope of the centre and will be wearing a Personal Alarm Transmitter as a safety precaution. Students are not expected to be responsible for any out of pocket expenses.
