The Riots and Restorative ustice program provided a timely contribution to discussions about justice reform in ritish olumbia The program's focus on the Stanley up riots grounded the discussion in circumstances that are widely familiar allowing for a robust and concrete dialogue to emerge Significant interest from regional media and policy makers has contributed to a major endorsement of restorative justice in the ustice Reform nitiative as a means to provide victims with a better sense of reparation and to reduce the risk of re offense
