The examination itself comprise 20-minuteoral presentation by the candidate to an open audience of lowed by abrief opportunity for questions from the audience lowed oral examination by the Examining Committee were only the candidate, Examining Committee members and Chair are present Chair will normally be the EASC Graduate Program Chair or a designate. The Chair is not a member of the Examining Committee and does not ask questions or vote on the outcome of the examination Prior to questioning from the Examining Committee, the Chair will remind the committee of the subject areas of focus agueed in advance.
