

The Geographic Information Science (GIS) certificate combines course in GIS, Remote Sensing, Quantitative Geography, Cartography and Visualization.

Students should consult with the Undergraduate Advisor for program admission. Formal approval is required before completion of the certificate.

Students may take the certificate in conjunction with an undergraduate degree or on its own. The certificate is an independent credential, but courses used for the certificate may also be applied to a degree program. Students can apply for the certificate in the semester in which it is completed, not necessarily in the semester in which they apply for graduation in the degree program.

While overlap between a certificate and a degree is allowed, credits applied to one certificate may not be applied to another SFU certificate or diploma. Therefore, students registered in more than one certificate should ensure that there is no overlap of courses between certificates.

Course Requirements

To qualify for the certificate, students must complete the following courses:

A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 is required in the courses used for the certificate.

Each student is responsible for ensuring that his or her academic choices meet the requirements for graduation.
