COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Towhat ends, and for whose benefit, do we undertakere search? What forms of knowledge are perceived to be valid and valuable? Whose voices "count"? These are some of the questions that serve as the basis for this course, in which we grapple with the <u>what</u>, the <u>why</u>, and the <u>how</u> of doing research.

Our discussionwill move between theory and method and will include opportunities for applied research practice with methods used in critical social science and historical fields of study. We will evaluate survey tools, visit an archive (virtually & in person) create a datawalk, and undertake an interview.

Along the way, we will return regularly to questions of knowledge production: how do we understand experience as expertise? How can practices of relational accountability reshapeour
