




SET Frameworks Across Canada

As part of the Student Experiences of Teaching and Course (SETC) program review, we will be considering the cascading question framework. core questions set by the university and individual questions set by the instructor, there are questions set by the unit/department, and by the Faculty. The purpose of Faculty and Academic Unit-level questions is undefined and this framework leads to long surveys, so as an institution we need to decide whether to keep the cascading framework, and if so, how to more clearly define the purpose for each level. As background, we reviewed question frameworks across Canada, as well as other large institutions in British Columbia.




The majority of other institutions are using a cascading framework. University of Victoria allows units to select from a restricted item bank, University of Saskatchewan includes modules (a group of items about one issue) that changes regularly. In contrast Carleton University uses a universal set across all units.

The table below outlines the different titles, conceptual frameworks, and links to relevant work at the other universities. This work can help guide us throughout the process of updating our own program.
