COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is auxivey of current syntactic theory within the generative framework along the lines of the Minimalist Program. The first part of the course will be concerned with various syntactic issues in clause structure: the derivation of phrases and clauses, theoisspetting up TP and VP into different levels of projections, crostinguistic variation in vertmovement, and principles governing other movement phenomena such as Dand WHmovement. The second part of the course will be concerned with various issuesoncerning the syntaxemantics interface, including the syntax of scope, constraints on DP interpretation reflected in Binding Theory, and reconstruction of different types of movement.
