1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this Appendix is to provide examples of conduct that is prohibited by section 5.1 of the Student Conduct Policy (S 10.05) (“the Policy”).

2.0 PROHIBITED CONDUCT

2.1 Misconduct is defined in section 2.8 of Appendix A to the Policy. Misconduct may result in the imposition of disciplinary measures. Examples of disciplinary measures are provided in Appendix C to the Policy.

2.2 Examples of Misconduct are provided below, in subsections 2.2.1 to 2.2.16 of this Appendix, to illustrate the type of conduct that is prohibited and will be subject to University action. Engaging in such conduct could lead to intervention or discipline by the University. This list of examples is not exhaustive and any conduct that a Student knows, or ought reasonably to know, is Misconduct is prohibited by Policy.

2.2.1 Misconduct Against People includes, by word or action:

- a. physical aggression, assault, intimidation, threats, or coercion;
- b. threatening or endangering the health, safety, or well-being of any person;
- c. sexual violence and misconduct, which means a sexual act or acts targeting a person’s sexual identity, gender identity, or gender expression that is committed, threatened, or attempted against a person without the person’s consent and may or may not involve physical contact. It includes, but is not limited to: sexual

intimidated,or harassed.
