2. What are the differences between the Honours program and the Major?

The main difference between these two programs is that the Honours Student undertakes authit Honours Seminar in the Fall term, and unit Honours Essay in the Sing term, working closely with one supervising professor over the seesmesters to complete this substantial, specialized research project.

Honours:

- x 120 total units
- x 60 upper division units
- x 48 upper division units in Political Scienime, luding POL 4995 Honours Essay and POL 490 Honours Seminar. An additional 8 of these 48 units must be at the 490

Major:

- x 120 units
- x 45 upper division units
- x 32 upper division units in Political Science, of which 8 units must be 4000
- 3. Why would a student reasonably choose not to do Honours?

An Honours program is intended to give the student advanced knowledge in one field or discipline. Students who are more interested in breadth than in specialization might decide to spread their studies over several epartments (with a Major and Minor, for example) preasstudents strong interested in two distinct disciplines might choose a Double Major.

5. Is an Honours degree necessary for admission to Law School?

No, an Honours degree is not a specific requirement for admission to Law School. Most law schools require a 4year degree to be eligibee
