# 1. CODE OF ACADEMIC HONESTY

## 1.0 Statement of Principle

All members of the University community hare the responsibility for the academic standards and reputation of the University ademic honesty is a cornerstone of the development and acquisition of knowledge cademic honesty is a condition of continued membership in the university community.

#### 2.0 Academic Dishonesty

Academic dishonesty, like other forms of hobsesty, is misrepresentation with intent to deceive or without regard to the source the accuracy of statement or findings. Academic dishonesty, in whatever form, is inducted destructive othe values of the University; it is furthermore unfair and discoraging to the majory of students who pursue their studies honestly. Scholarly ginitely is required of all members of the University.

## 3.0 Forms of Academic Dishonesty

The illustrations presented below are considered to be representative but not definitive nor exhaustive of activities which could be considered to constitute academic dishonesty.

(a) Plagiarism is a form of academic dishonesty in which an individual submits or presents the work of another person assolution own. Scholarschiquite properly rests upon examining and referring to the thoughts avritings of others. However, when excerpts are used in paragona or essays, the author scholar acknowledged using an accepted disciplinary format. Footnotes, endstore ferences and bibliographies must

If an author's phrases or sentences are **es**, the copied material must be placed inside quotation marks. Following the quotation marks a proper citation, including a specific page reference, must be included.

(b) Submitting the same essay, presentation, or assignment more than once whether the earlier submission was at the another institution, uess prior approval has been obtained.

2. Whenever you <u>summarizer paraphrase</u> deas from other material, you must likewise give the exact source. Paraphramesists of a restatement in substantially

- (i) issue a formal reprimand to the student;
- (ii) assign a grade penalty less harsh than "F" for the course;
- (iii) assign a grade penalty of "F" for the course;
- (iv) initiate a hearing by referring thease to the University Board on Student Discipline (UBSD)[Academic Policy T1 0.03]

The Chair shall communicate any and all decisiin writing to the student and copies of all such communications will be sent the Registrar. The student will be advised that the report will be retained in the studefiltes in the Office of the Registrar and that, in the event of any further reports of acadendishonesty, the report may be used in determining a penalty for any used used offence.

(d) If, in the case of (a) or (cthe student wishes to disput the finding offact of the instructor or department Chair, the studentary present an appeal to the UBSD, in writing, stating reasons for the trappeal, within eighteen days the date of notification by the instructor or department Chair.
