- x Parameter of success academic, completion rates, etc. If parameters are set for credential reviews. ensure that they apply fairly to all credentials.
- x A suggestion was made for export at the faculty level after for years
- x A suggestion was made to include **at st**nent in the NOI/FPP re: how and when to review this program
- x A question was raised for reviewing existing programs, which sometimes experience a period of dormancy;how and when to decide if this dormant period is permanent?
- x A suggestion was made tocorporate a probation period bed discontinuing a program, including discussions on why theorgram wasnot successful, and then proceed to suspension/deletion.
- x A comment was made toekep a review deadline in minals students do not communicate internation declare and may be working towards a credential prior to admission into the program.

All agreed it would be useful to reviewer/ort at the five-year markand to establish metrics for succestors the discontinuation of a credential

The Chair noted that there was opposition for reviewing a new program within a reasonable amount of time and agreed that adding individual metrics within the **NPP** for reviewwill benefit students well as faculties.
