Comments made:

- x Relief that the pilot was ending as there wasn't enough data for advisors to work with when consulting students about their academic plans
- x The WE system is in place for students faced with personal emergencies or other extenuating circumstances; however, it was not intended as a solution for students in academic difficulty
- x It's important to talk to faculty and get further feedback, hesitant to extend this system as is.
- x There are good arguments to having an EGS with community consultation, it may be the new system will look similar to the current one with a few upgrades
- x We shouldn't renew until further consultation with students and instructors to better understand the value in an EGS, e.g. where students can explore other courses outside of their programs – but until then it makes sense to let it expire
- x There may be different solutions we haven't yet explored.
- x The pilot EGS was an emergency response and it served its purpose, do develop a new EGS. We need to evaluate how it supports students now as opposed to as a response to the pandemic.
