- 8. Senate Library Committee & Library Penalties Appeal Committee Annual Reports for 2012/13 (Natalie)

- 9. Library Fines Proposal, response to auditor's recommendations (Elaine)
 The Library was recently audited and one area that was queried was the amount of fines outstanding. It was asked why the Library did not take more action to collect these fines.
 Currently we have 8,000 patrons with fines owed totaling \$370,000; many of these are former students, now alumni. 1,500 patrons owe over \$50 which translates to \$260,000.
