Verkerk also provided some background adding that work had already begun by the offices of the Registrar and University Advancement along with the Human Rights and Legal offices in creating these types of scholarships and awards. She noted that committees have also been working together with the Ministry of Advanced Education to ensure data is appropriately collected and properly used which will be useful information going forward for this project.
