

Document Requirements for Application to
SFU Graduate Program
School of Interactive Arts & Technology

All application materials must be uploaded to the admission system. The application fee must be paid

English language proficiency requirement:

Demonstrated proficiency in the English language through one of the following means:

A previous undergraduate or graduate degree completed at an institution where the language of instruction and examination was in English, in a country where English is the primary language.

OR

- x Scores that meet or exceed the SFU minimums on one of the university approved English-language tests. Note that test results must be completed within two years of the program start date.

Applicants are required to provide English language test scores at the time of application in the self-report field.

Portfolios and Writing Samples:

While not required applicants who have portfolios or a previous thesis are encouraged to submit those as optional documents in the application.

If you wish to include an **optional** portfolio in your online application there are no specific requirements for the portfolio. SIAT is an interdisciplinary department and applicant portfolios (if submitted) should showcase prior works as appropriate for the applicant's background.

Candidates who are being strongly considered for admission may be contacted and required to submit a previous thesis or portfolio of their work and/or be interviewed during the latter stages of the admissions process.

The Admissions Committee may, in its sole and absolute discretion, deny admission to any applicant notwithstanding that the applicant meets the minimum standard entrance requirements.
