Your progress is formally evaluated twice a year; the complete evaluation takes place at the end of the Spring Term and the partial evaluation is early in the Fall Term. Progress milestones are detailed in the *SIAT Term Timeline of Milestones and Awards* and summarized below. It is essential that your progress be reviewed as satisfactory, as unsatisfactory progress has a negative impact on your access to awards, appointments, and resources. Students may be required to withdraw from the program after an unsatisfactory progress in accordance with the SFU policy on unsatisfactory progress¹.
