Prerequisite:

Completion of all required lower division courses and at least 15 upper division credits required in the program or permission of the instructor.

Course Description:

A seminar for students undertaking a major or an honors program in management and systems science.

Outline:

This seminar brings speakers from off-campus to speak to students about professional experiences and careers related to the disciplines that MSSC includes. The first time it is taken the credit is for MSSC 480 and the second time it is MSSC 481. MSSC majors and honors must take both MSSC480 and 481 but the seminar may also be taken as an elective by non-majors, on approval of the MSSC coordinator. The course is normally taken in the final semesters of the students undergraduate program.

Grading:

Evaluation is based on attendance at the seminars, participation in the seminars, and the submission of a brief report on each seminar.
