

Having a disability means you are part of a legally protected category of people under Human Rights legislation. This means we need to be able to verify the presence and impact of a disability through documentation to ensure students with disabilities receive their entitled supports. If you do not yet have documentation that meets the criteria below, please feel free to email us with anything you do have on file – a brief doctor's note, a hospital discharge form or other information by other medical providers. You can send to <u>cal_admin@sfu.ca</u>, asking if it would suffice for an intake.

We may be able to get you started with interim accommodations while you gather appropriate documentation.
