Starting April 30, 2024, you may be eligible to apply for an open work permit within Canada, if your spouse/common-law partner meets the following criteria:

- have a valid study permit;
- study <u>full-time</u> or have proof of full-time enrollment;
- enroll in <u>a master's/doctoral/professional degree</u> program or participating in an <u>eligible pilot program</u>; and
- be physically residing in Canada or plan to stay in Canada while pursuing your program.
