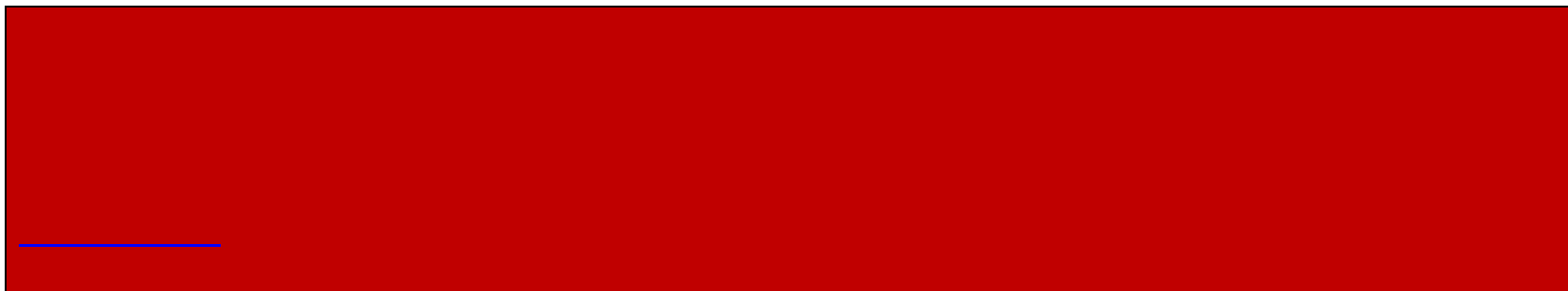
Use the table below to identify the health, safety, and security hazards associated with your exchange term, and how you are planning to reduce the impact or likelihood of those hazards affecting your exchange.

I will closely monitor local government websites, Global Affairs Canada and International SOS, and keep my home Study Abroad Officer and host institution informed, should I become aware of issues
	Travel Insurance coverage	Travel medical insurance coverage available is restricted and may not cover expenses related to COVID-19 infections.	I will have medical coverage that will allow me to access medical services, including those related to COVID-19 infections.
	Unanticipated costs associated with your Exchange term being cancelled.	For various reasons my exchange term may be cancelled or method of delivery changed with little notice for the remainder of my exchange term. There may be unanticipated costs incurred as a result.	I will ensure to have funds available to cover unanticipated costs, such as emergency international travel. I realize that Simon Fraser University may have limited support available and that I will need to cover these unanticipated costs.

	Fraud	Potential for foreigners to be a target of fraud.	
	Traveling with technology	Some countries make it illegal to use strong encryption. Border officials have broad powers to inspect and seize electronic devices. Potential for identify and/or personal information theft.
