

Teachers in the Faculty of Arts and Social Science (FASS) are provided with comprehensive programs and services dedicated to curricular and pedagogical practice and innovation. Here are a list of them contributing to teaching and learning in the faculty followed by their respective descriptions:

1) The Student Learning Commons (SLC): provides remedial and supplemental learning services, in-classroom learning opportunities, peer-to-peer academic assistance, and one-to-one instructional consultation with Dr. Amanda Goldrick-Jones, an expert in the field of learning pedagogy.

2) EdMedia: a specialized initiative within the Teaching and Learning Centre (TLC) providing special services for multimedia classroom enhancement activities (classroom recording, video capture, graphic design, etc.).

3) Teaching Men of the Program: an interdisciplinary and teaching-specific men of the program hallmarks are all well-recognized in the established efforts of the department to guide and support the pedagogical development of its members.

11) Librarian : beyond conventional teaching and learning, SFU has a cohort of digital-specific liaison librarians available for one-to-one consultation and critical analysis.

12) EdMedia Program : a long-term holistic approach to blended learning and multi-media tools to help facilitate, design, develop, and implement multi-media tools for instructional purposes (including video production, data visualization, etc.).

13) Rethinking Teaching Workshop : an annual, 4-day immersive and intensive workshop through which faculty design or redesign a full-scale course of study.

14) Instructional Skills Workshop (ISW): a workshop in pedagogical development for graduate students; ISW completion is a requirement for enrollment in the Certificate Program in University Teaching and Learning.

15) Certificate Program in University Teaching and Learning (CPUL): a long-term effort to develop pedagogical development for graduate students,
